REED SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Shelton, June 20, 2017---- Ten recipients of 2017 Mark E. Reed Scholarships were recently named by the program's Washington Board, according to John Ison, board chairman. The winners each received \$3,000 awards on June 14, 2017, after touring Green Diamond Resource Company timberlands and a dinner celebration at the historic Colonial House.
