Mississippi Team Earns Top Honors at National 4-H Forestry Invitational

Mississippi placed first among 10 states that competed in the 44th annual National 4-H Forestry Invitational from Sunday July 21 through Wednesday July 24. Teams from Indiana and Tennessee placed second and third, respectively. Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Utah, and Virginia also competed in this year's Invitational.

The invitational was held at West Virginia University Jackson's Mill State 4-H Camp and Conference Center near Weston, West Virginia. The event is sponsored by Farm Credit, Green Diamond Resource Company, Society of American Foresters, Southern Regional Extension Forestry, F and W Forestry, Virginia Cooperative Extension, and West Virginia University Extension.

While at the Invitational 4-H members competed for overall team and individual awards in several categories. Events included tree identification, tree measurement, compass and pacing, insect and disease identification, topographic map use, forest evaluation, the forestry bowl and a written forestry exam.

The Mississippi team members were Samuel Davidson, John Clayton Kitchens, Joy Kitchens, and Josie Thompson. The team coach was Ray Henderson with assistant coaches Jennifer Henderson and Ashlyn Henderson.

Indiana's Clark Showalter had the highest overall individual score in the contest. The second-place individual was Lane Taylor from Florida and the third-place high score was a tie with Jose Thompson from Mississippi and Maegan Metzger from Indiana.

The Joe Yeager "Spirit of the Invitational" award was presented to Holt Sapp from Georgia. This award recognizes an outstanding 4-H contestant at the Invitational. It is presented to the individual who takes initiative, is enthusiastic, and is eager to lead academic and social situations.

The Tommy and Susan Futral Inspiration of the Invitational Award was presented to Ray Henderson from Mississippi. He has been a 4-H volunteer leader and coach for many years. Coaching multiple 4-H forestry teams to the forestry invitational and other competitive events over the years.
